



Letter of Agreement  
Between  
Burlington United Methodist Family Services  
&

Marion County Board of Education

Burlington is applying for a grant to provide Intensive Case Management Services to children, ages 0 through 21, in Kanawha, Raleigh, Berkeley, Cabell, Harrison and Marion Counties. The population to be served will have a mental health and or substance abuse diagnosis that resulted in functional impairment which substantially interferes with or limits the child's role or functioning in family, school, or community activities. This would be demonstrated by the child's current or past history of symptoms or behaviors indicating the need for a crisis intervention due to suicidal or homicidal ideation, physical aggression toward others, self-injurious behavior, serious risk-taking behaviors (running away, sexual aggression, sexually reactive, or substance use). The child's symptoms and behaviors are unmanageable at home, school, or in other community settings due to the deterioration of the child's mental health or substance abuse condition. These symptoms and behaviors would require intensive, coordinated clinical interventions (who require services from two or more child serving systems, who are at risk of placement, or currently placed in a psychiatric treatment facility or an acute care psychiatric hospital who cannot return home without extra support, linkage, and services provided by wraparound and who are in the legal custody of their parent/caregiver). We currently provide similar services for youth in the Safe at Home Program.

We will provide quality services in a timely manner, readily accessible and tailored to meet individual and family needs. Stakeholders will work in collaboration to provide a range of supports that involve services which assist the participants in meeting their goals. The agency signing this agreement may refer participants to Burlington or receive referrals from Burlington. The participant's success depends on collaboration between stakeholders. Collaboration will be necessary when working with some of the very difficult issues that may exist. Stakeholders will meet with the Intensive Case Management Services staff as needed and agreed on, to develop a plan and share appropriate information concerning the participant. A statement of confidentiality regarding participants must be signed by both the stakeholder and Burlington.

This program will be made available to participants of all races, language, genders, sexual orientation, age, and socioeconomic characteristics. Either party may cancel the agreement at any time.
